

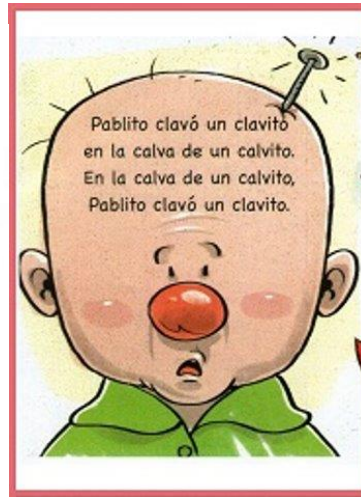

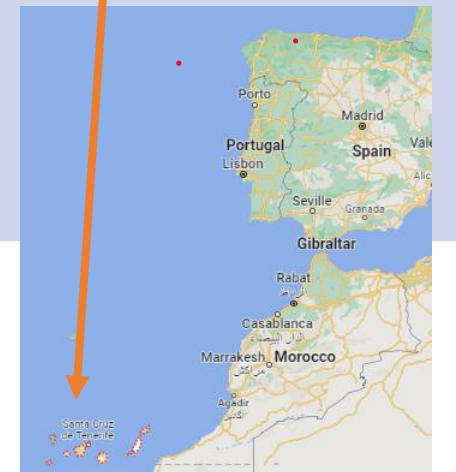

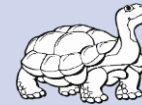
- All nouns in Spanish have gender, they are either masculine or feminine. Very often nouns ending in “o” tend to be masculine nouns, and when they end in “a” they tend to be feminine nouns.

- The determiner “a/an” (indefinite article) is “un” for masculine nouns in singular, and “una” for feminine and singular nouns.

The history of Carnival in Mexico dates back to the colonial days when Spaniards brought their Catholic beliefs and traditions.

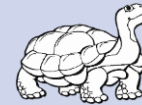

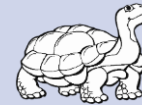

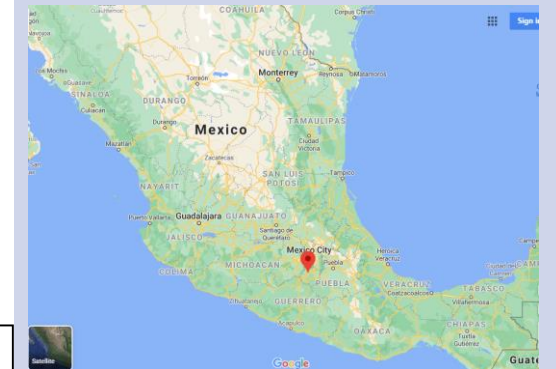
