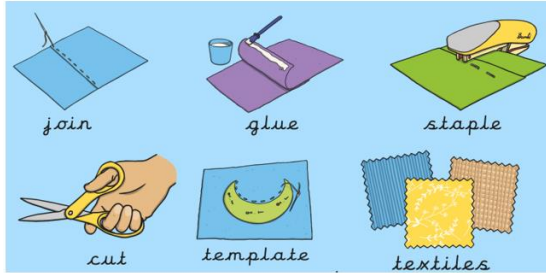


Vocabulary

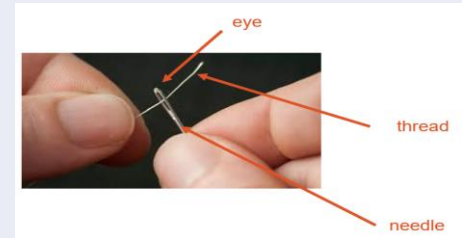
**Steps for making your blanket:**

1. Cut out the butterfly template on the card.
2. Place it on the fabric and draw round it using chalk.
3. Cut out the two butterfly template.
4. Pin the two pieces of fabric together using pins.
5. Thread your needle.
6. Start sewing your bag together using the running stitch.

- Fabrics can be joined together by sewing and gluing and pinning.
- Geometric shapes can be a good choice when choosing fabric embellishments for a design.

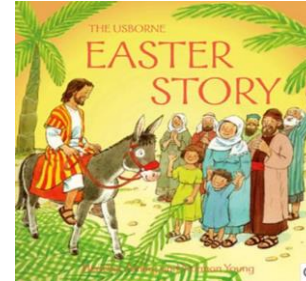
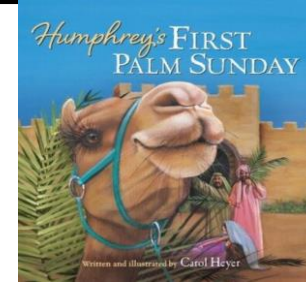

 Easter Sunday is the day, Christians believe Jesus rose again from the cross.

**Sticky Knowledge**

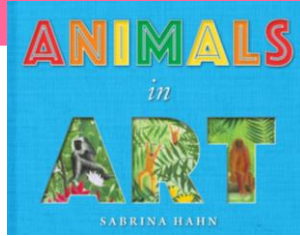
- Important people have special welcomes.

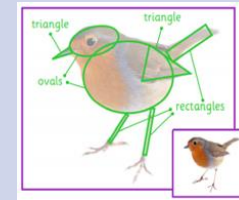

Sketching

Pencil sketching uses a range of techniques. There are lots of different shapes used to make the basic shape of this robin. Look carefully at how the shapes fit together to create the base needed before detail is added.

Observational Drawing

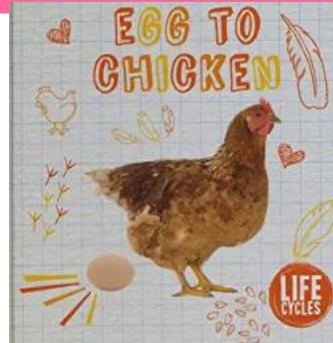
An observational drawing is when you draw what you see. This means you have to look really closely and draw what you actually see.





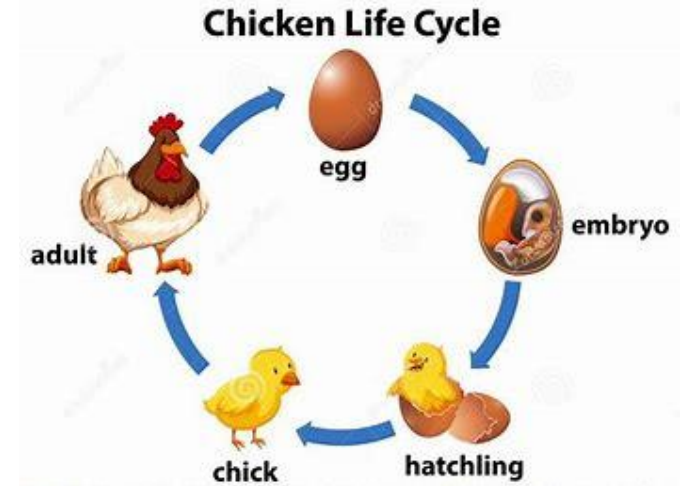
